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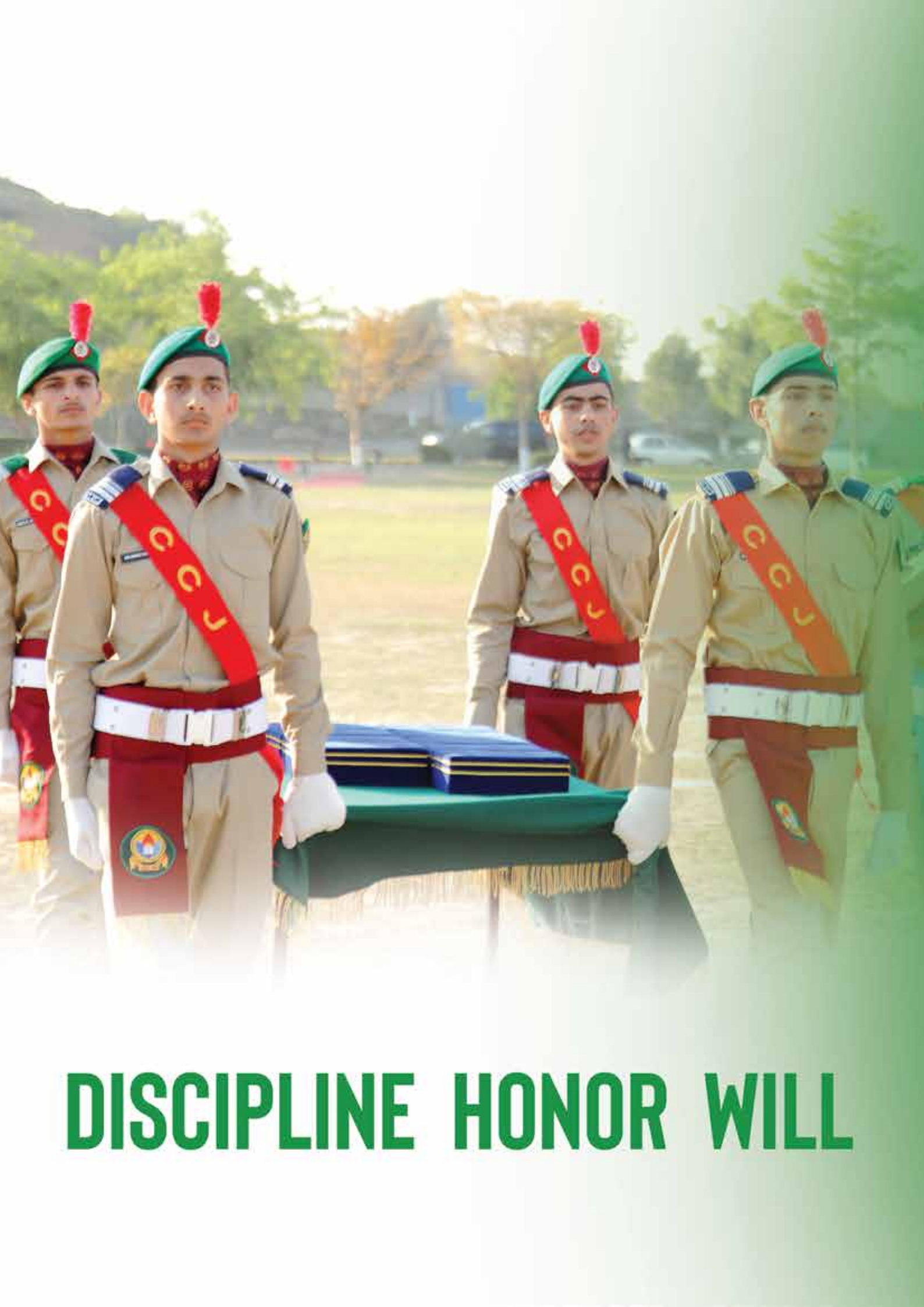

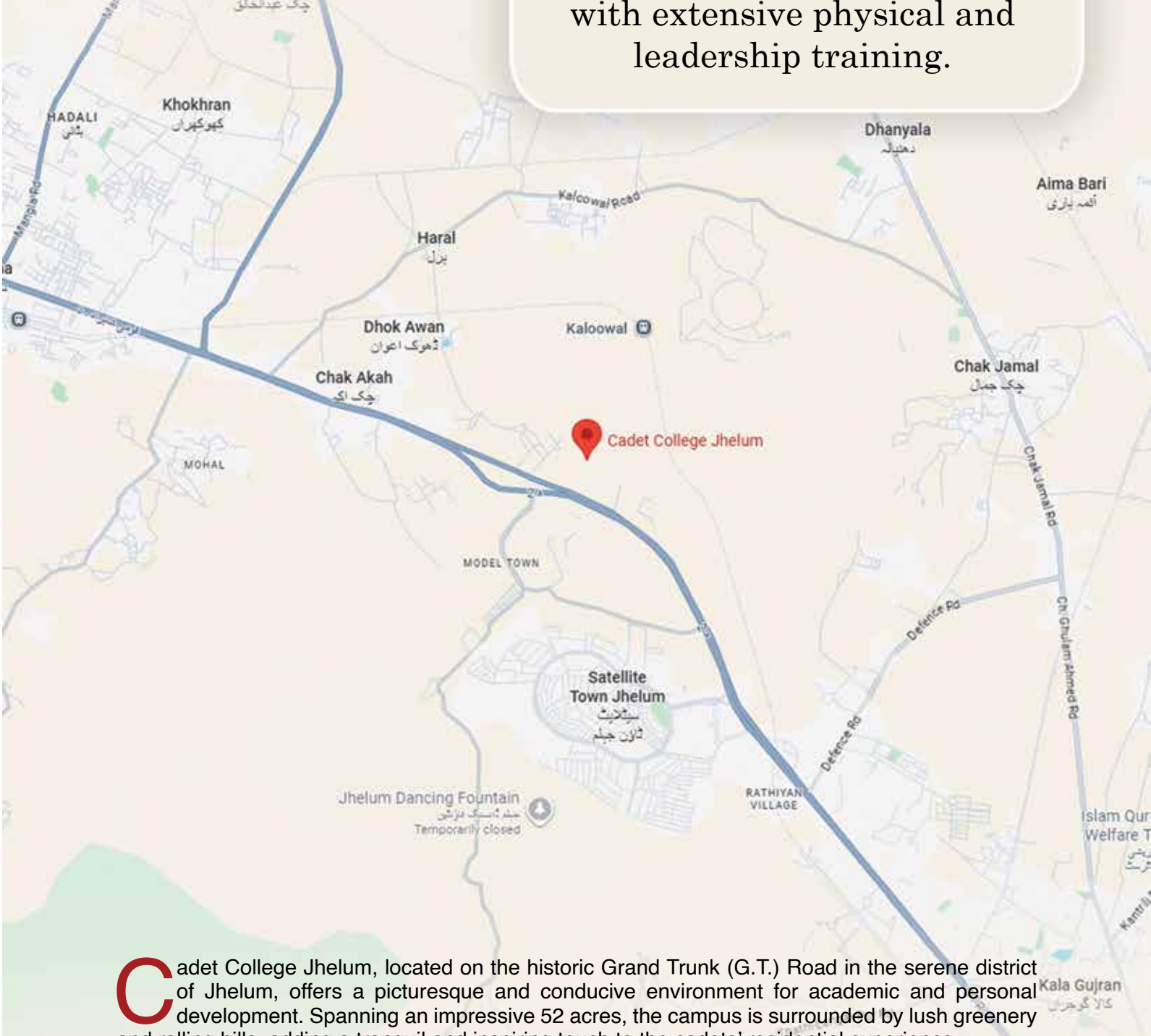


Cadet College Jhelum was established in 2008 with the vision of providing quality education, disciplined training, and character-building for young cadets aspiring to serve the nation. Inspired by the legacy of Pakistan's prestigious cadet colleges, it was founded to instill academic excellence, leadership qualities, and a strong moral foundation in its students. Originally spanning 20 acres, the college has since expanded to 52 acres, featuring fortified 10-foot walls, razor wire fencing, and multiple observation posts, ensuring a secure and disciplined environment conducive to learning. It operates under a Board of Governors, with academic affiliation from the Federal Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education (FBISE) and a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the Pakistan Air Force (PAF), reinforcing its credibility and commitment to military-style education. Located in the serene and hilly region of Jhelum, the college offers a calm, airy, and pollution-free atmosphere, ideal for intellectual and personal growth. With state-of-the-art facilities, it provides education from 7th grade

to 12th grade, including FSC Pre-Medical, FSC Pre-Engineering, and ICS. Following a student-centered learning approach, the college maintains a student-to-teacher ratio of 20:1, ensuring personalized academic attention and rigorous training. The institution is well-equipped with a modern science block, a mess facility, and Masjid-e-Razia, where cadets offer compulsory five-time daily prayers, fostering spiritual discipline and moral integrity. Supporting him both as a teacher and a father figure during that time was one of the most emotionally profound experiences of my career. His courage left an indelible mark on my soul. Yet, through every storm and sleepless night, one truth remains: Cadets are forged by struggle but crowned by strength. They do not merely survive challenges—they rise above them. Cadet College Jhelum does not simply produce graduates; it shapes leaders, visionaries, and nation-builders.

As a biology Lecturer, I often reflect on Darwin's wisdom: "The strongest are not the most aggressive, but those who adapt and endure." And these boys—my cadets—embody that very spirit. When they leave these walls, they are not just cadets; they are men of purpose, ready to lead with honor and compassion.

March 2025 brought a moment of pure euphoria. One of my cadets ran to me, tears in his eyes, joy in his voice: "Sir, I passed the MDCAT! My name is on the merit list—I'm going to medical college!"

At that moment, I remembered these lines:

"Efforts bear fruit, though sometimes late—
Every dark night eventually sees the dawn."
Indeed, every sacrifice, every tear, every trial was worth it.

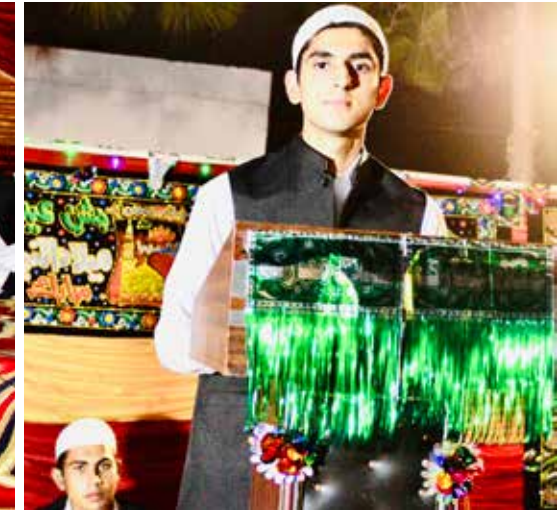
leadership avenues within the Navy, including branches like Operations, Engineering, and Medical, among others.
